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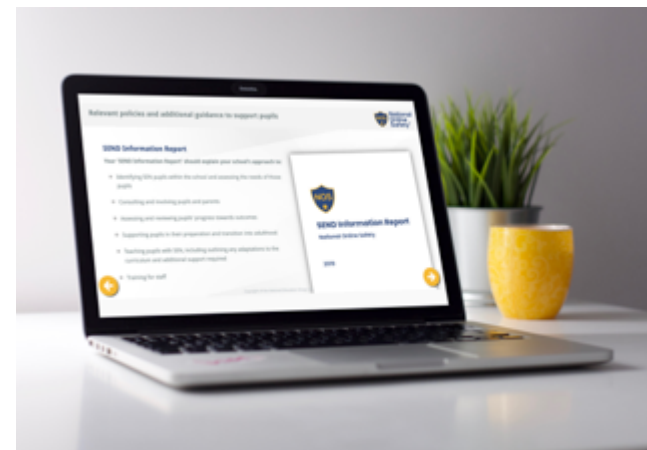
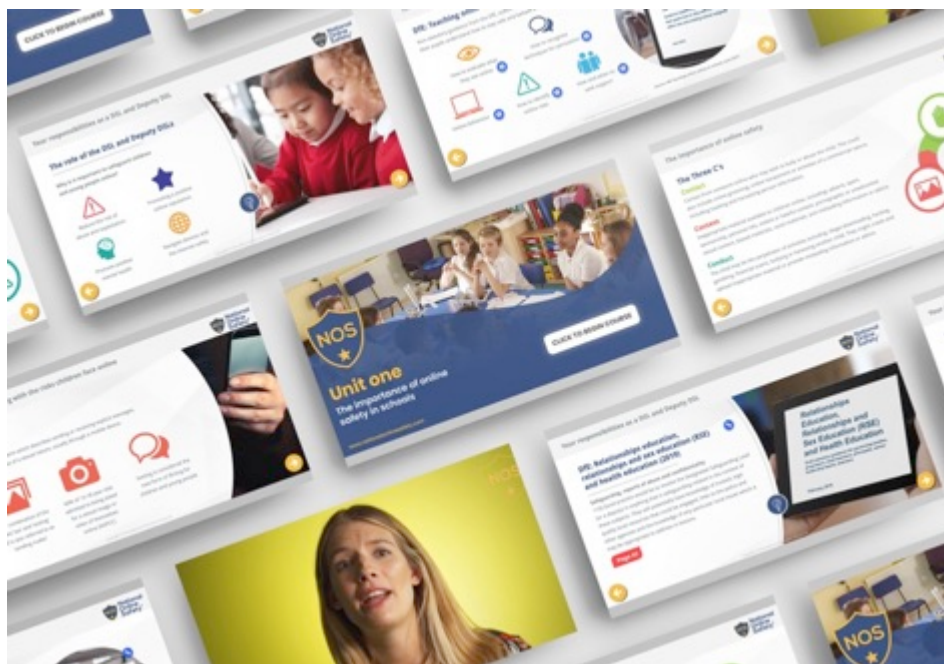

The importance of online safety

The Three C's

Contact

Contact from someone online who may wish to bully or abuse the child. This could also include online grooming, online harassment or activities of a commercial nature, including tracking and harvesting personal information.

Content

Inappropriate material available to children online, including: adverts, spam, sponsorship, personal info, violent or hateful content, pornographic or unvetted sexual content, biased materials, racist materials, and misleading information or advice.

Conduct

The child may be the perpetrator of activities including: illegal downloading, hacking, gambling, financial scams, bullying or harassing another child. They might create and upload inappropriate material or provide misleading information or advice.

Dealing with the risks children face online

Any form which describes sending or receiving explicit messages, or content of a sexual nature, usually through a mobile device.



60% of 13-18 year olds admitted to being asked for a sexual image or video of themselves online (NSPCC)



Sexting is considered the new form of flirting for children and young people

A combination of the words 'sex' and 'texting' is also referred to as 'sexting nudes'

Safeguarding, reports of abuse and confidentiality

119) Good practice would be to involve the Designated Safeguarding Lead (or a deputy) in anything that is safeguarding-related in the context of these subjects. They will potentially have knowledge of trusted, high quality local resources that could be engaged, links to the police and other agencies and the knowledge of any particular local issues which it may be appropriate to address in lessons.
