Immigration and Recruiting Staff from Overseas

According to a recent report published by the House of Commons Library in the 2019-20 financial year there was a sharp decrease in the number of QTS awards to overseas staff in comparison to the 2015-16 peak. The UK witnessed a 49% decrease of QTS awards from the EEA and 31% decrease in those awarded to candidates from Australia, Canada, New Zealand and the United States.

With new government initiatives designed to target staff around STEM subjects and with no drop in demand from schools, it's vital that School Business Professionals are not missing out on this talent pool. In this workshop we'll explore how schools and trusts can effectively navigate the recruitment of overseas staff.
