Nick Bowen

After 10 successful years in the North East as Headteacher at St Benet Biscop Catholic High School, where Nick received the Queens Award for Enterprise Promotion, he moved to Barnsley to set up Horizon Community College.

As Principal Designate, he managed the closure and amalgamation of two failing schools to form a state of the art £50 million school for 2,300 students.

As Principal, he successfully navigated the school through significant change, experiencing all the issues above, yet managing to retain and recruit quality staff, get parents on board and significantly raise aspirations and outcomes for young people.



As Executive Principal, he managed the Barnsley Schools Alliance, leading on school improvement across the borough and led Horizon, one of the biggest secondary schools in the country, to be part of a hugely successful academy trust: HCAT

For many years, Nick was a Headteacher Ambassador for the Youth Sports Trust, the Women's FA and the Career and Enterprise Company. Nick is now a professional speaker who became the Professional Speakers Association 'Emerging Speaker of the Year' for 2025.

Keynote Overview- The Power of Belonging

Nick's keynote talk focuses on Authentic Leadership and how this creates a culture of Belonging, Dignity and Fulfilment enabling the perfect balance of Empowerment and Accountability to work its magic.

Nick has a powerful grasp of the story telling aspect of his message, exploring the lighter side of working in schools as well as bringing to life some of the colourful characters in those communities, whilst emphasising the importance of authentic leadership.

Workshop Overview - Making Difficult Decisions for the Right Reasons

Senior leaders often repeat the same mantras:

"We have no money."

"It's not in the budget."

"Funding cuts make it impossible."

"Parents would go to the press."
